I would never make such a request, and **this is a scam. Repeat, this is a scam.** An example of one of the scam emails is below:



Subject: Re: Quick One
 Okay Mary,
 Here is what I want you to do. I have been working on incentives recently and I aimed at surprising the selected executive board with Apple gift cards of \$500 face value each, Therefore, I need 4 pieces of it, amounting to \$2000. You can get them at any store close to you, such as Walmart, CVS and Walgreens. I need you to get the physical cards , scratch the back out to unveil the cards pin, snap the pins clearly one after the other with your phone camera to have 4 Apple gift cards sent to me via this email ' [REDACTED]@onmail.com' to give to the selected executive. Can you get these done today or when?, and you will be reimbursed back.

Benefits Health Care

As I discussed last month it is important to keep abreast at what is going on with our earned benefits. At a recent video conference with MOAA National, benefits were discussed. One item that stuck out was our medical benefit. To show you how significant it is, civilian DOD staff medical benefits cost DOD \$22,463 per family per annum. The premium that staff pay annually is \$6105. That is what our benefit is worth. It is vital that we keep it.

Also during the video conference it was mentioned that MOAA National provides two significant benefits. First, their website includes webinars on many subjects of interest to members. Second, they have transition services for military transitioning from military service to civilian life. Both are free to Premium and Life members.

[Legislative News October 2023](#)

There are many active legislative campaigns listed on the MOAA website on the Key Advocacy Center at <https://moaa.quorum.us/issueareas>. The website includes six categories—Active Duty, Family, Guard & Reserve, Retirees, Survivors, and Veterans.

One of the featured alerts under the Active Duty tab is entitled “[Help MOAA Reverse Pharmacy Network Cuts](#).” I would encourage you to visit this site and take action by contacting Congress using the drafted message. Here is more information on this alert: “Urge your Representative to co-sponsor H.R. 5150--a bill requiring a detailed report on the pharmacy network, which has been cut by more than 13,000 locations since 2022.”

One of MOAA’s top priorities is a report requirement to evaluate the impact of recent TRICARE Pharmacy network cuts on beneficiary access to care—such a report will help advance our efforts to reverse the network cuts. Please join MOAA in urging lawmakers to co-sponsor a standalone bill to ensure robust report requirements are included in the FY 2024 NDAA.”

Some other important issues include, “[Urge Your Legislators to Support the Respect for Grieving Military Families Act](#),” “[Tell Congress You Oppose TRICARE/TRICARE for Life Fee Increases](#),” and “[Urge Congress to Expand TRICARE Coverage to Certain ‘Gray Area’ Retirees](#).”

From the “[Active Legislative Campaigns](#)” page, click on the “Write” button to the right of the title and description of each bill. Fill out your personal information and then click the “Submit” button at the bottom of the page. The entire process takes about two minutes.
